SPEAKING TEST INSTRUCTIONS PET Format

The Speaking test takes about 10 - 12 minutes.

A participant does the test with a partner (another student).

There are two examiners in the room but only one of them will talk to participants. Both examiners will give participants marks for the test. The examiner will ask a participant some questions and also to talk to her/his partner.

Part 1 (2 - 3 *minutes*)

The examiners introduce themselves to participants. One examiner asks each participant a few questions on familiar topics (where you live, your school, your interests, etc.) and asks participants to spell their names.

Part 2(2-3 minutes)

The examiner gives participants a drawing and explains what they have to do. Both participants talk about it together.

Part 3 (3 minutes)

The examiner gives a participant a photograph. She/he shows his/her photograph to his/her partner and describes it. Then second student is given a photograph to describe.

Part 4 (3 minutes)

The examiner asks participants to talk together about the subject of the photographs in Part 3. Participants tell each other their opinions or describe their experiences.




